My Grade 11 (Junior Year) Checklist

This is what I have done by the end of my Junior Year.



- I have checked to make sure that I have enough credits to get my high school diploma by June of next year.
- I will have confirmed that I have taken all my mandatory or compulsory credits for my diploma by the end of next June.
- I have compiled my record of volunteer or community service hours with letters of recommendation from my supervisors.
- All my school records show my correct personal data.
- All my records show my correct marks.
- I have confirmed that any night school, summer school, e-course, AP, IB or independent learning course is included in my records.
- I know what a transcript is. I know the cost involved and I will know how to order a transcript.
- I have created a college file for all my documents and for any important dates and requirements coming up next year.
- I have spoken with teachers and with other students so that I have an idea of which senior courses will produce the heaviest workload for me.
- With my guidance counselor, I balanced my timetable so that I do not have all the most difficult courses in the same semester.
- I have chosen and will continue to choose the most rigorous program or slate of courses designated as college preparation courses which I know are acceptable for college entrance. These courses do not include community college preparation courses, workplace entrance courses, cooperative education courses or open-level courses.
- At the beginning of my Junior year I wrote my Preliminary SATs and later my SATs or ACTs or SAT subject tests, if necessary.
